AN ACT in relation to exceptions and appeal in criminal cases.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. Section twenty-seven of chapter one hundred  
2 and thirty-five of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by  
3 adding at the end thereof the following words:

‘But in all other criminal cases amounting to a felony, where  
5 like motion is filed and appeal taken to the law court the con-  
6 currence of a majority of the justices shall be necessary to  
7 grant such motion and no sentence shall be imposed until af-  
8 ter final judgment.’
