STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE, in favor of the Healy Asylum with Statement
of Facts.

Resolved: That there be and is hereby appropriated to the
2 Healy Asylum, located at Lewiston, the sum of three thou-
3 sand dollars for the year nineteen hundred and nine and the
4 sum of three thousand dollars for the year nineteen hun-
5 dred and ten for maintenance. Also the further sum of one
6 thousand dollars for the year of nineteen hundred and nine
7 and one thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred and
8 ten for repairs.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Healy Asylum was founded in Lewiston, Me., in 1893 for the purpose of providing a home for little boys who have been left orphans or have been forsaken by their parents.

Since its establishment, 2238 friendless boys have been admitted to this institution at ages ranging from 3 to 13 years. There is no discrimination in regard to race or creed. The children come from 33 cities and towns in the states. During the past year 287 boys have been admitted. The largest number of any given day was 180. The average number resident during the past year was 175.

The institution is supported by money received for the board of children and the State appropriation. The expenditures for the past year were \$14,280.32—the receipts were \$7,962.67, leaving a debt of \$6,317.70 on current expenses.
