# STAFE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE, in favor of the town of Cornville.

*Resolved*, That there be paid to the town of Cornville the 2 sum of fifteen dollars and seventy-five cents, it being the 3 amount due said town for tuition of pupils in secondary 4 schools for the years nineteen hundred and four, nineteen 5 hundred and five and nineteen hundred and seven, but not 6 reported by that town in those years.

12 and for incorporating such description in deeds when lands 13 are sold for taxes; also for the employment of a competent 14 person or persons to assist said board of State assessors in 15 making special explorations in wild land townships to ascer-16 tain for taxation purposes their just and fair value. Said 17 board in their regular report shall incorporate a report of 18 the work done under this resolve and a summarized state-19 ment of their expenditures.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This resolve is for the reimbursement of the town of Cornville for the tuition of pupils in secondary schools under the provisions of sections 63 and 64 of chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes. The town of Cornville paid the town of Skowhegan for tuition of two pupils in the Skowhegan high school the sum of \$31.50 for the school years ending July 1, 1904, July 1, 1905 and July 1, 1907. This entitles the town of Cornville under the provisions of the above named section to the sum of \$15.75.

Owing to the inability of the State Auditor to draw a warrant against the free high school appropriations for the years 1904, 1905 and 1907, this method was taken as the most simple to secure a sum properly due from the State to the town of Cornville.
