STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in relation to Fort William Henry in the town of Bristol.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of fifteen hundred dollars for the use of the Pemaquid 3 Commissioners, the same to be used in completing and fur-4 nishing the memorial tower of Fort William Henry, and 5 for such other purposes connected with the care of the 6 reservation and State property thereunto appertaining as 7 may in their judgment be necessary.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The State of Maine owns this property. It has already expended on it about \$4,300, and there has been expended by private persons about \$3,000.

The tower itself was completed the last season, but additional funds are needed to furnish it with appropriate furniture suitable for the proper display of the valuable relics and for the care and preservation of this historic property.

A commission of three persons appointed by the Governor of the State has the matter in charge.
