STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend Section 9 of Chapter 127 of the Revised Statutes of Maine, relating to cheating by false pretenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. That section nine of chapter one hundred and 2 twenty-seven of the Revised Statutes of Maine, be and is 3 hereby amended by adding after the word "Republic," in 4 the second line of said section, the words 'United Spanish 5 War Veterans, Union Veteran's Union,' and by adding after 6 the word "Republic," in the fifth line of said section, the 7 words 'United Spanish War Veterans, Union Veteran's 8 Union,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as fol-9 lows:

HOUSE-No. 139.

Sect. 9. Whoever willfully wears the badge of the Grand 11 Army of the Republic, United Spanish War Veterans, Union 12 Veteran's Union, or of the Sons of Veterans, or uses or 13 wears the same to obtain aid or assistance thereby, within 14 the State, unless he shall be entitled to use or wear the same 15 under the rules and regulations of the Department of Maine, 16 Grand Army of the Republic, United Spanish War Veterans, 17 Union Veteran's Union, or of the Sons of Veterans, shall 18 be punished by imprisonment for not more than thirty days, 19 or by fine not exceeding twenty dollars, or by both such 20 fine and imprisonment.'
