STATE OF MAINE.

AN ACT to appropriate moneys for the protection of trees and shrubs from the introduction and ravages of dangerous insects and diseases.

Whereas, the gipsy and brown-tail moths have been declared by law to be public nuisances and their suppression and the prevention of their introduction into this State, and the protection of trees and shrubs from the introduction and ravages of dangerous insects and diseases, require constant work now being carried on under the direction of the Commissioner of Agriculture and the interruption of said work until ninety days after the recess of this Legisltaure would be harmful to the public health, and

Whereas, by reason of the foregoing facts this measure is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public health and an emergency, as contemplated by the Constitution exists, now therefore,

Section I. For the purpose of carrying into effect all pro2 visions of law now in force, or as the same may be amended
3 and added to, relative to the protection of trees and shrubs
4 from the introduction and ravages of dangerous insects and
5 diseases, there is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in
6 the treasury the sum of thirty-five thousand dollars an7 nually. Any part of this appropriation remaining unex8 pended at the end of any calendar year may be expended un9 der the supervision of the Commissioner of Agriculture,
10 upon presentation of properly approved bills for the same.

Sect. 2. This act, two-thirds of all the members elected to 2 each house having so directed, shall take effect when ap-3 proved by the Governor.
