IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend the charter of the City of Ellsworth.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The act incorporating the town of Ellsworth 2 into a city, approved February 8th, eighteen hundred and 3 sixty nine, with the amendments thereof and additions there-4 to is hereby amended and added to as follows:

Sect. 2. The aldermen of said city shall receive a com-2 pensation of fifty dollars per annum each, subject to such 3 deduction by way of fines for non-attendance at meeetings 4 as may be voted by the board of mayor and aldermen, and 5 the aldermen shall not be eligible to any other salaried city 6 office. Sect. 3. At the time of the annual appointment of city 2 assessors next after this act goes into effect a board of three 3 assessors of taxes, one for a term of one year, one for a 4 term of two years, and one for a term of three years, shall 5 be appointed as provided in said act of eighteen hundred 6 sixty-nine and amendments thereof and additions thereto, 7 and thereafter one assessor shall be appointed each year for 8 a term of three years. Such board shall have, execute and 9 be subject to the same powers, duties and liabilities now held 10 by and incumbent upon the assessors provided for in said act.

Sect. 4. No member of the school board of the city of 2 Ellsworth shall be eligible to the office of superintendent of 3 schools of said city.
