
RESOLVE proposing an amendment of the Constitution providing for the election of the Secretary of State, Treasurer and Attorney General by the qualified electors.

Resolved, That the following amendments to the consti-2 tution of this State, be proposed for the action of the legal 3 voters of this State in the manner provided by the consti-4 tution, namely:

Section I. Section one, Article V, part third of the con-2 stitution of this State, as amended by Article XXIII, is 3 hereby amended, so that the same shall read as follows:

'Section 1. The Secretary of State shall be elected by the 5 qualified electors, and shall hold his office two years from 6 the first Wednesday of January next succeeding his electron.'

- Sect. 2. Section one, Article V, part fourth of the con-2 stitution of this State, as amended by Articles XXIII and 3 XXVII, is hereby amended so that the same shall read as 4 follows:
- 'Section 1. The Treasurer shall be elected by the quali-6 fied electors, and shall hold his office two years from the 7 first Wednesday of January next succeeding his election, 8 but shall not be eligible more than six years successively.'
- Sect. 3. Section II of Article IX of the constitution of 2 this State as amended by Article XXIII, is hereby amended 3 so that the same shall read as follows:
- 'Sect. 11. The Attorney General shall be elected by the 5 qualified electors and shall hold his office two years from 6 the first Wednesday of January next succeeding his electron. Vacancy in said office may be filled by the appointment of the Governor with the advice and consent of the 9 Council.'
