STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend the charter of the Dead River Log Driving Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I of Chapter 279 of the Private Laws of 1880, 2 entitled "An Act incorporating the Dead River Log Driving 3 Company," is hereby amended by striking out all of said 4 section one after the period following the word same in the 5 thirteenth line thereof and inserting instead thereof the 6 following: 'And said company shall drive all logs and other 7 timber coming into said Dead river between the forks of 8 Dead river and the Kennebec river and into Little Spencer 9 stream between Big Spencer pond and Big Spencer stream

10 and into Big Spencer stream between its junction with Little II Spencer stream and Dead river for the purpose of being 12 driven to market, and said corporation is authorized to build 13 dams, side dams, remove rocks, make embankments and 14 other improvements on Little Spencer stream or Big Spen-15 cer stream between its junction with Little Spencer stream 16 in Dead river and on Dead river and build dams to raise a 17 head of water on any and all the lakes and ponds on said 18 streams or river or other tributaries, to facilitate the driving 19 of logs and lumber down the same, and for this purpose 20 the said corporation may take land and materials necessary 21 to build such dams, embankments and improvements and 22 may flow contiguous lands necessary to raise such head of 23 water on such lakes and ponds, and if the parties cannot 24 agree upon the damage the corporation shall pay the pro-25 prietors of the land and material so taken, such damages as 26 shall be ascertained and determined by the county com-27 missioners for the county of Somerset in the same manner 28 and under the same conditions and limitations as are by 29 law provided in the case of damage by laying out public 30 highways, and for the damage occasioned by flowing land 31 the said corporation shall not be liable for an action at 32 common law, but the person injured may have a remedy 33 by a complaint for flowing, in which the same proceedings 34 shall be had as when a complaint is made under a statute 35 of this State for flowing lands occasioned by raising a head 36 of water for working of mills. Said corporation shall have 37 all the powers and privileges and be subject to all the lia-38 bilities incident to corporations of a similar nature,' so that 39 said section as amended shall read as follows:

That Elias Milliken, Joseph Clark, J. M. 41 Haynes, Franklin Smith, J. R. Bodwell, William B. Snow, 42 Ira D. Sturgis and Abner Coburn, their associates and suc-43 cessors, be and they are hereby made a body politic and 44 corporate, by the name and style of Dead River Log Driv-45 ing Company, and by that name, may sue and be sued, 46 prosecute and defend to final judgment and execution, both 47 in law and in equity, and may make and adopt any and all 48 regulations and by-laws not repugnant to the constitution 49 and laws of the State, and may adopt a common seal, may 50 hold real and personl estate sufficient to carry on success-51 fully the business of the Dead River Log Driving Com-52 pany, and may grant and vote money for the same. 53 said company shall drive all logs and other timber coming 54 into said Dead river between the forks of Dead river and 55 the Kennebec river and into Little Spencer stream between 56 Big Spencer pond and Big Spencer stream and into Big 57 Spencer stream between its junction with Little Spencer 58 stream and Dead river for the purpose of being driven to 50 market, and said corporation is authorized to build dams, 60 side dams, remove rocks, make embankments and other im-61 provements on Little Spencer stream or Big Spencer stream 62 between its junction with Little Spencer stream in Dead 63 river and on Dead river and build dams to raise a head of 64 water on any and all the lakes and ponds on said streams 65 or river or other tributaries, to facilitate the driving of logs 66 and lumber down the same, and for this purpose the said 67 corporation may take land and materials necessary to build 68 such dams, embankments and improvements and may flow 69 contiguous lands necessary to raise such head of water on 70 such lakes and ponds, and if the parties cannot agree upon 71 the damage the corporation shall pay the proprietors of 72 the land and material so taken, such damages as shall be 73 ascertained and determined by the county commissioners 74 for the county of Somerset in the same manner and under 75 the same conditions and limitations as are by law provided 76 in the case of damage by laying out public highways and 77 for the damage occasioned by flowing land the said cor-78 poration shall not be liable for an action at common law, 79 but the person injured may have a remedy by a complaint 80 for flowing, in which the same proceedings shall be had as 81 when a complaint is made under a statute of this State for 82 flowing lands occasioned by raising a head of water for 83 working of mills. Said corporation shall have all the pow-84 ers and privileges and be subject to all the liabilities inci-85 dent to corporations of a similar nature.'
