STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to prevent the desecration of the thirtieth day of
May, commonly known as Memorial Day, and providing pen-
alty for violation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to hold, give or carry on
2 any carnival, circus, circus parade, ball game, horse-racing
3 or any other sporting entertainment in public on the thirtieth
4 day of May, commonly known as Memorial day.

Sect. 2. No city in the State of Maine shall authorize,
2 license or permit any of the entertainments mentioned in
3 section one of this act.

Sect. 3. Any person violating the terms of this act shall,
2 upon conviction, be fined not less than five hundred dollars
3 nor more than five thousand dollars for each offense.
