STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE providing for the repair of the highway in Washington Plantation and Perkins Plantation in Franklin County.

Resolved, That the sum of one thousand dollars be, and

- 2 hereby is, appropriated to repair the highway leading from
- 3 Wilton to Weld through Washington Plantation and Per-
- 4 kins Plantation in Franklin County. Said appropriation to
- ${\mathfrak z}_{{\mathfrak z}}$ be expended under the direction of the county commissioners
- 6 of said county of Franklin.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The highway leading from Wilton to Weld through Washington Plantation and Perkins Plantation is a road used more extensively than any other highway in any of the unorganized townships in Franklin County. This is due to the fact that the lumber mills in Weld ship their lumber through to Wilton station, and that nearly all of the produce from the farms in Weld and the merchandise in Weld passes over this road. Further, the summer travel into Weld, which amounts to nearly one thousand people, and the necessity of two daily stages during the tourist season, pass over the road. With the taxable property in the plantations and the other roads required to be kept in repair, make the highway tax a burden upon the inhabitants, and at the same time does not provide for a suitable highway through the said plantations.
