STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend chapter 176 of the private and special laws of 1907 relating to fishing in Bartlett and Cook's Brook, in the County of York.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section 1 of said chapter is hereby amended

- 2 by inserting after the word "mill-pond" at the end of the
- 3 fifth line the words "except Tuesdays and Fridays of each
- 4 week during open season for fishing under the general law,"
- 5 and by striking out the words "for a period of three years"
- 6 in the sixth line, and by adding to the sixth line the words
- 7 "this act shall be in force until the year 1912" so that said
- 8 section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch

10 or kill any kind of fish at any time in Bartlett's and Cook's 11 brook, so-called, from and beginning at its source, the out12 let of Bartlett pond, situated in the towns of Lynian and 13 Waterboro, (and all its tributaries), to and as far as C. F. 14 Clark and Son's mill pond except Tuesdays and Fridays of 15 each week during open season for fishing under the general 16 law. This act shall be in force until the year 1912.'

- Sect. 2. Section 3 of said chapter is hereby repealed.
- Sect. 3. It shall be unlawful for any one person in any 2 one day to take, catch or kill more than 20 fish in these 3 waters.
- Sect. 4. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this 2 act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the 3 general law for illegal fishing for trout and land-locked 4 salmon, and municipal courts, police courts and trial justices 5 shall have original and concurrent jurisdiction with the su-6 preme and superior courts for all violations of this act, and 7 all fines collected thereunder shall be paid to the State 8 Treasurer for the protection of fish.
