STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Stratton brook and tributaries,
situated wholly or partly in the County of Franklin.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or
2 kill any kind of fish at any time in Stratton brook, so-called,
3 or any of its tributaries, situated wholly or partly in Frank-
4 lin County, except in the ordinary method of casting with
5 artificial flies or fly fishing. It shall be unlawful for any
6 one person to take and kill more than ten trout in one day
7 in any of these waters, and no trout less than eight inches in
8 length shall be taken and killed in any of these waters, during
9 the same period.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this
2 act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the
3 general law of the State for the illegal fishing for and catch-
4 ing of trout and land-locked salmon.

Sect. 3. Municipal and police judges and trial justices
2 within their respective counties shall have original and con-
3 current jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts in
4 all prosecutions arising under this act.
