IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND NINE.

---

AN ACT to authorize Florence B. Alley and others to fence  
Alley Cemetery in the town of Boothbay, and to erect monu-  
ments or markers at the graves therein.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. Florence B. Alley of New York and Byron  
2 Giles of Boothbay in the State of Maine and such descendants  
3 and relatives, of people buried in the Alley cemetery in the  
4 town of Boothbay, Maine, as may associate themselves with  
5 the said Alley and Giles are hereby authorized and empow-  
6 ered to erect monuments, head stones or markers at any or  
7 all of the graves in the Alley cemetery. They are further  
8 authorized to build a good substantial fence around said  
9 cemetery and to cross the land of Mabel V. Conkling or

10 others, by the usual travelled way in going from the town  
11 road to said cemetery.

Sect. 2. If any disagreement arises between the parties  
2 above named and the owners of the land surrounding said  
3 cemetery, as to the true boundaries of the cemetery, such  
4 boundaries shall be determined by three disinterested men.  
5 The said Alley, Giles and their associates to choose one out  
6 of three persons named by the owners of the land, and the  
7 owners of the land shall choose one from three persons  
8 named by the said Alley, Giles and their associates, and the  
9 third shall be chosen by the two so selected.
