STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to provide for a close time on Hungarian partridges,
so-called.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to hunt, chase, catch, kill
2 or destroy or have in possession at any time any Hungarian
3 partridge, so-called, for a period of four years from the time
4 this act takes effect, under a penalty of not less than five dol-
5 lars nor more than ten dollars and costs for each offense and
6 a further penalty of five dollars for each Hungarian par-
7 tridge unlawfully caught, killed or had in possession.

Sect. 2. Municipal and police courts and trial justices
2 within their counties shall have, upon complaint, original
3 and concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme and superior
4 courts in all prosecutions arising under this act.
