IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend Chapter 42 of the Public Laws of 1907, entitled "An Act to prevent desertion and non-support of families."

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:*

Section 1. Amend section 3 of said chapter 42 of the Public Laws of 1907, by inserting after the words "police courts" in the fifth line thereof the words "and trial justices" so that said section when so amended shall read as follows:

'Section 3. All fines or penalties provided for by the terms of this act may be recovered or enforced by complaint or indictment and in all prosecutions under this chapter and any amendments and additions thereto, judges of municipal

9 courts and police courts and trial justices within their re-  
10 spective counties shall have original and concurrent juris-  
11 diction with the superior and supreme judicial courts.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
