STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE, that the land agent be authorized to convey to George F. D. Trask, of East Bluehill, Hancock County, Maine, "Conary's Nub" so-called, East Bluehill.

Resolved, That the State land agent be and is hereby authorized and empowered, upon payment of a reasonable sum, to execute and deliver a sufficient deed releasing to George F. D. Trask and his heirs and assigns, all the right, title and interest which the State of Maine has in and to the small islet called "Conary's Nub" off Trask's Point, at East Bluehill in Hancock County.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Conary's Nub is a small unoccupied barren islet of about an acre in area, situated in Bluehill Bay, about one thousand feet from the land of George F. D. Trask. No particular claim of ownership has ever been set up by any individual so far as known, other than by the owner of the adjacent land to whom it is proposed to release it to quiet the title. No use has ever been made of the islet and it is not to be conceived that any practical use could be made of it, other than by him. The value, if anything, is nominal.
