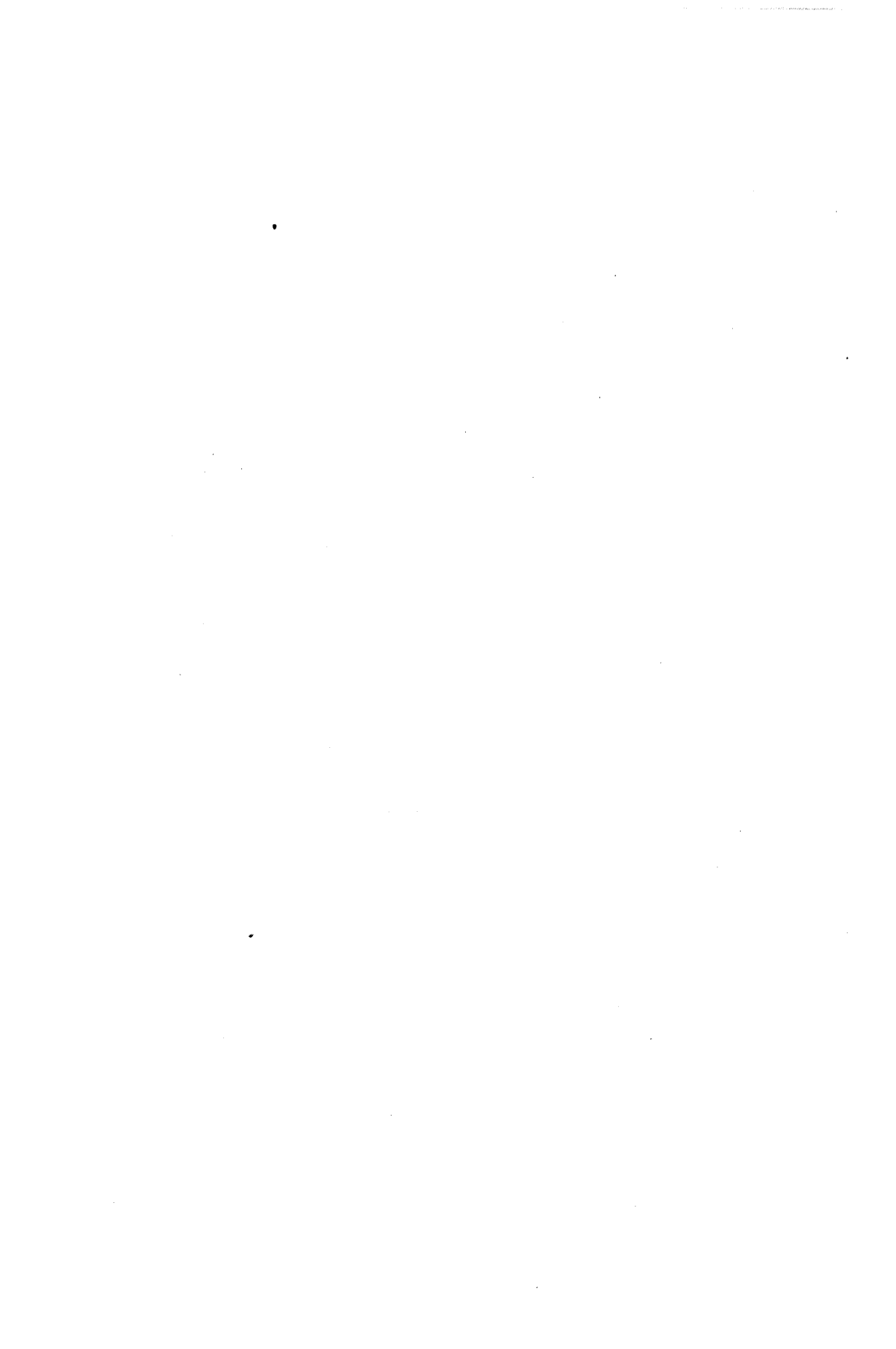
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to legalize, make valid and binding certain acts and
doings of the town of Whitneyville.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. All the acts and doings of the municipal officers
2 of the town of Whitneyville, in the County of Washington,
3 on the twenty-ninth day of April, in the year of our Lord
4 nineteen hundred and seven, in connection with proceedings
5 on the petition of Edwin J. Miller and eleven other legal
6 voters of said town, (which was dated at Whitneyville, April
7 29, 1907, and was recorded by the deputy clerk of said town,
8 in Book B, at page 239, under date of April 29, 1907), pray-
9 ing for the taking of about three-fifths of an acre of land of
10 the adjacent owners of the "Dunning field," so called, situat-

11 ed on the east side of the public cemetery in said Whitney-
12 ville, to enlarge said cemetery for a public burying-ground,
13 so far as relates to proceedings on April 29, 1907, to take
14 said quantity of land to enlarge said cemetery for a public
15 burying-ground, together with the records of said petition
16 and proceedings, in Book B, Pages 239 and 241-2, respec-
17 tively, are hereby ratified, confirmed, and made as valid and
18 binding as though every condition of the statute laws govern-
19 ing the taking of land of adjacent owners to enlarge public
20 burying-grounds had been fully complied with in said peti-
21 tion and all the proceedings thereunder to take said land.
