IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend section twenty of chapter forty-one of the
Revised Statutes of nineteen hundred and three, relating to
Sea and Shore Fisheries.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section twenty of chapter forty-one of the
2 Revised Statutes of nineteen hundred and three is hereby
3 amended by striking out the words "ten and one-half" in
4 the first line and inserting in place thereof the words 'four
5 and three-fourths'; and in the second line as aforesaid after
6 the word "measured" and inserting in place thereof the
7 words 'in accordance with section seventeen of chapter forty-
8 one of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter forty-
9 nine of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seven,' so
10 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 20. No person shall can lobsters less than four and
12 three-fourths inches in length, alive or dead, measured in
13 accordance with section seventeen of chapter forty-one of
14 the revised statutes, as amended by chapter forty-nine of
15 the public laws of nineteen hundred and seven; and for
16 every lobster canned contrary to the provisions of this sec-
17 tion, every person, firm, association or corporation so can-
18 ning shall be liable to a penalty of one dollar for every lob-
19 ster so canned contrary to the provisions of this section, and
20 a further penalty of three hundred dollars for every day
21 on which such unlawful canning is carried on.'
