RESOLVE in favor of the State Board of Veterinary  
Examiners.

---

*Resolved,* That there be and is hereby appropriated the  
2 sum of one hundred and seventy-six dollars and fifty-eight  
3 cents to pay the following bills incurred by the State Board  
4 of Veterinary Examiners, to wit: Wallace S. Ladd of Au-  
5 gusta, for printing, twenty dollars and sixty-eight cents;  
6 Dr. W. S. Lord of Portland, for traveling expenses and  
7 hotel bills, sixty-four dollars; Dr. F. E. Freeman of Rock-  
8 land, for traveling expenses and hotel bills, thirty-eight  
9 dollars; Dr. A. Joly of Waterville, for traveling expenses  
10 and hotel bills, fifty-three dollars and ninety cents.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Since the establishment of the State Board of Veterinary Examiners, one hundred and eighteen men have been registered. Under the law, no fee was received from one hundred and eight of the above number, for the reason that they were in practice before the passage of the law. The fees received from the other ten have not been sufficient to pay expenses, with the result that the bills mentioned in the accompanying resolve are unpaid. No appropriation has ever been made by former legislatures to cover expenses in connection with this Board. The members of the Board are very desirous of having these bills settled to the first of the present year. The members of the Board do not receive any compensation for their services.
