STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Bremen.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of sixty-eight dollars (\$68.00) to reimburse the town 3 of Bremen in the county of Lincoln and State of Maine, 4 for money expended by it during the year nineteen hun-5 dred and seven, as set forth in the accompanying statement 6 of facts. •

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The selectmen and overseers of the poor of the town of Bremen, viz: F. O. Kent, J. L. Homan and W. L. Hilton, certify that about the 1st of November, 1907, they received a written notice from Crosby K. Wellman of said town, stating that Mrs. Cora Strang of Danielson, Conn., had become insane at his house and that he should look to the town for her support. Upon investigation it was found that Mrs. Strang was insane, and at the expiration of about one month, being able to travel, was conveyed to her home at Danielson, Conn.

The selectmen and overseers aforesaid paid Mr. Wellman for Mrs. Strang's care and support, and for time and expenses in conveying her to Connecticut, the amount of \$60.00, as per bill rendered; also for preparing evidence of her residence, justice fees, etc., have incurred an expense of \$8.00, making a total of sixty-eight dollars (\$68.00).
