IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to protect the white perch in Ellis pond, sometimes called Roxbury pond, in the towns of Roxbury and Byron in the County of Oxford.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. During the open season on white perch provided in the general law of the State, it shall be unlawful for any one person in any one day to take, catch or kill or have in possession more than twenty white perch taken, caught or killed in Ellis pond, sometimes called Roxbury pond, in the towns of Roxbury and Byron, in the County of Oxford, under the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the State for illegal fishing or catching of perch.

Sect. 2. Municipal and police courts and trial justices in  
2 their respective counties shall have original and concurrent  
3 jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts in all of-  
4 fenses arising under this act.
