STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in that portion of Rangeley Lake
known as South Bog, in Franklin County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or
2 kill any kind of fish at any time in that portion of Rangeley
3 Lake known as South Bog, bounded by a line drawn from
4 the South Rangeley wharf to Dixon wharf on South Bog
5 Island, Rangeley lake, and from that point to the wharf at
6 Bungalow camp that is situated on the mainland, except in
7 the ordinary way of casting with artificial flies or fly fishing
8 or by trolling.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this
2 act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the
3 general law of the State for the illegal fishing for and catch-
4 ing trout and land-locked salmon.

Sect. 3. In all prosecutions arising under this chapter,
2 municipal and police courts and trial justices within their
3 respective counties, shall have, upon complaint, original and
4 concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts.
