STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Jimmy brook, so-called, in the towns of Cambridge and Parkman, in the counties of Somerset and Piscataquis.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or 2 kill any kind of fish at any time in Jimmy brook, so-called, 3 in the towns of Cambridge, in Somerset county, and in the 4 town of Parkman in Piscataquis county, which brook flows 5 into Mainstream, so-called, for a period of four years from 6 the time this act takes effect. Whoever violates any of the 7 provisions of this section shall be subject to the same pen-

8 alty as is provided in the general law of the State for the 9 illegal fishing for and catching trout and land-locked sal-10 mon.

Sect. 2. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and 2 police courts and trial justices within their respective coun-3 ties, shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent 4 jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts, and all 5 fines, forfeitures and penalties received for violation of this 6 act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving the same 7 to the State Treasurer, and credited to fines and license fees 8 for the protection of birds and game.
