STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of aiding the building of a bridge across
the Fish River.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the
2 sum of \$4000, to aid in the erection and construction of a
3 bridge across Fish River at Soldier Pond, in Wallagrass
4 Plantation, and the same to be expended under the direction
5 of some person appointed by the governor and council.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Soldier Pond where this bridge is to be built is eight miles south of Fort Kent. It connects Wallagrass with New Canada and will also connect the east and west side of Eagle Lake. There is a highway road on each side of Fish River for a distance of eighteen miles with a single crossing at the above named place where this bridge is to be built. The inhabitants using a ferry boat to cross at said place.

The length of the bridge will be about 360 feet with the abutments, and will cost about \$7000.
