## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend Section nine, Chapter fifty-five of the Revised Statutes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section 9 of Chapter 55 of the Revised Stat-

- 2 utes of Maine pertaining to telegraph and telephone com-
- 3 panies is hereby amended by inserting after the words "float-
- 4 ing debt" in the fourth line thereof the following words:
- 5 "Retiring previous bond issues." Also by adding after the
- 6 word "issued" in the eleventh line thereof the words "unless
- 7 to be retired by the new issue," so that said section as
- 8 amended shall read as follows:

'Section 9. Any corporation organized under the provis-10 ions of this chapter, by vote at a meeting of its stockholders called for the purpose, may issue coupon or registered bonds to provide means for constructing its lines and plant, funding its floating debt, retiring previous bond issues, or for the payment of money borrowed for any lawful purpose, and may mortgage or pledge as security for the payment of the principal and interest of such bonds, a part or all of its property and franchise. Such bonds may be issued in sums not less than \$100 each, payable at periods not exceeding twenty years from the date thereof, and bearing interst not exceeding 6% a year, payable annually or semi-annually, to an amount which, including that of bonds previously issued, unless to be retired by the new issue, shall not exceed in all the capital stock of the corporation actually paid in at the time.'
