STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Mount Blue Stream, the outlet of Mount Blue Pond, in the town of Avon, in Franklin County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or
2 kill any kind of fish at any time in Mount Blue stream, so-
3 called, the outlet of Mount Blue pond, in the town of Avon,
4 in Franklin county, except on Tuesday, Thursday and Sat-
5 urday of each week, on which days it shall be lawful to fish
6 in said stream in accordance with the general law of the
7 State. During the open season on said Mount Blue Stream
8 it shall be unlawful for any one person to take, catch or
9 kill more than twenty-five fish in all in any one day taken

10 from said waters. Whoever violates any of the provisions
11 of this act shall be subject to the same penalty as is pro-
12 vided in the general law of the State for the illegal fishing
13 for and catching of trout and land-locked salmon.

Section 2. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and
2 police courts and trial justices within their respective coun-
3 ties shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent
4 jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts and all
5 fines, forfeitures and penalties received for any violation of
6 this act shall be paid forthwith to the person receiving the
7 same to the State Treasurer, and credited to fines and license
8 fees for the protection of birds and game.
