STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Alder Stream in the County
of Piscataquis.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch, or
2 kill any kind of fish at any time in Alder Stream, in the
3 towns of Brownville, Milo, and Medford, in the County of
4 Piscataquis, for a period of five years from the first day of
5 July, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and nine.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this
2 act shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten dollars
3 nor more than thirty dollars and costs for each offence and
4 a further penalty of one dollar for each fish taken, caught,
5 killed, or had in possession in violation of the provisions
6 hereof.

Sect. 3. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and
2 police courts and trial justices within their respective coun-
3 ties shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent
4 jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts, and all
5 fines, forfeitures and penalties received for violation of this
6 act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving the same
7 to the State Treasurer, and credited to fines and license fees
8 for the protection of birds and game.
