STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend section 3 of chapter 407 of the Private and
Special Laws of 1903, relating to fishing in Rangeley stream,
so-called.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. So much of section 3 of chapter 407 of the
2 private and special laws of 1903 as prohibits fishing in
3 Rangeley stream, so-called, Franklin county, from the sign
4 at the old wharf near the head of said stream down to the
5 dam across said stream, in accordance with the general law
6 of the State is hereby repealed. Provided, however, that
7 during open season on that part of said stream above named
8 it shall be unlawful to fish except in the ordinary way of
9 casting with artificial flies or fly fishing, and no person shall

10 take and kill more than one fish in any day in said waters.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this
2 act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the
3 general law of the State for the illegal fishing for and catch-
4 ing trout and land-locked salmon.

Sect. 3. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and
2 police courts and trial justices within their respective coun-
3 ties shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent juris-
4 diction with the supreme and superior courts, and all fines,
5 forfeitures and penalties received for violation of this act
6 shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving the same to
7 the State Treasurer, and credited to fines and license fees
8 for the protection of birds and game.
