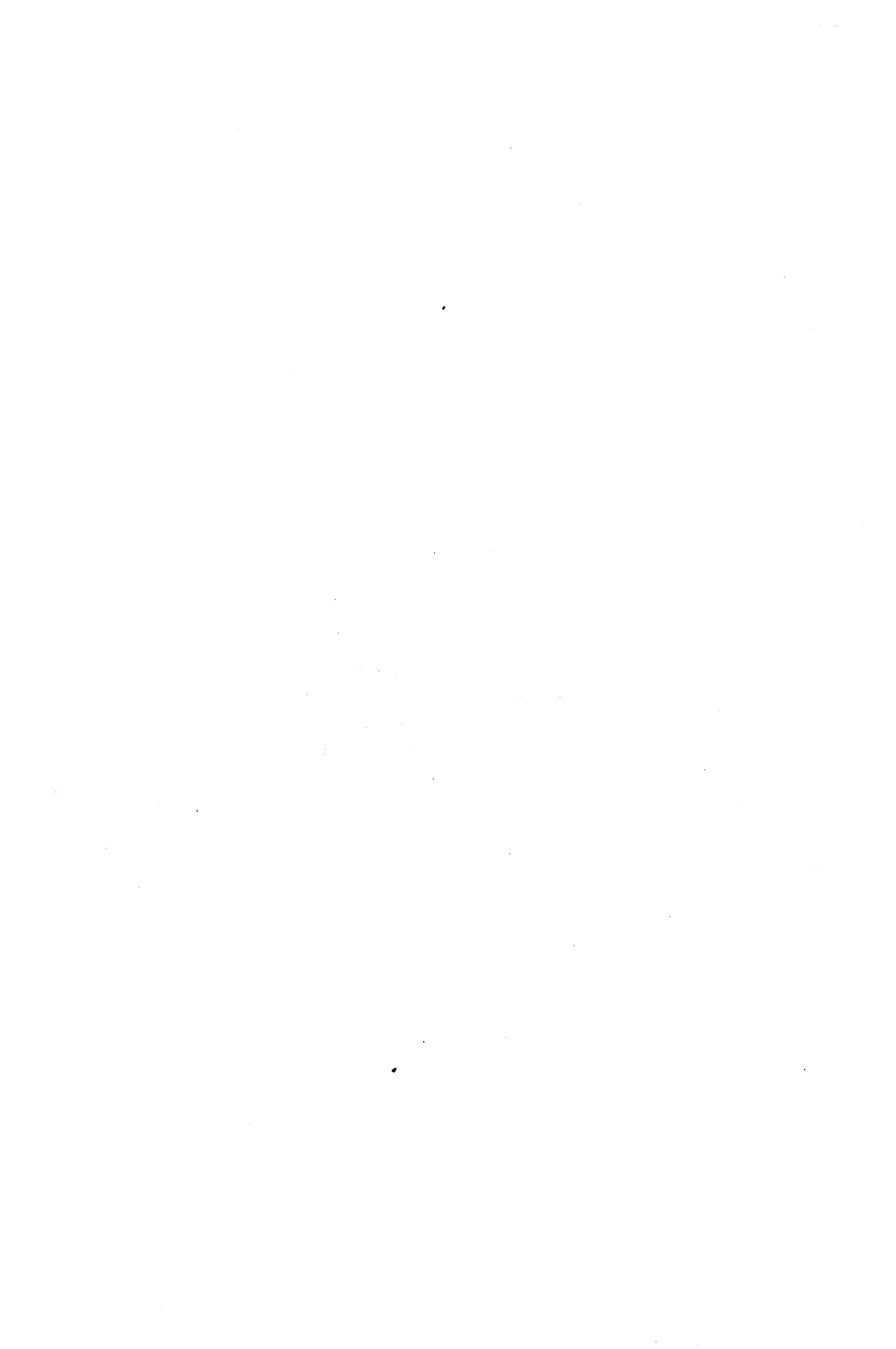
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Horn pond and Hanscom brook,
in York County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or
2 kill any kind of fish at any time in Horn pond, so-called, in
3 the town of Limington, in York County, from the first day
4 of October of each year to the first day of the following
5 May. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill
6 any kind of fish at any time in Hanscom brook, so-called, a
7 tributary to Horn pond. Whoever violates any of the pro-
8 visions of this section shall be subject to the same penalty as
9 is provided in the general law of the State for illegal fishing
10 for and catching trout and land-locked salmon.

Sect. 2. In all prosecutions arising under this act, police
2 and municipal courts and trial justices, within their re-
3 spective counties, shall have, upon complaint, original and
4 concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts,
5 and all fines, forfeitures, and penalties received for any vio-
6 lation of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person re-
7 ceiving the same to the State Treasurer, and credited to fines
8 and license fees for the protection of birds and game.
