STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to prohibit fishing in the tributaries to Flying Pond,
in the town of Vienna, Kennebec County, Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or
kill any kind of fish at any time in any of the tributaries to
Flying Pond, which pond is situated in the town of Vienna,
County of Kennebec and State of Maine, except in Sucker
brook, so-called, in which brook it shall be unlawful to fish
only from Ernest Whittier's dam to said Flying pond.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act
shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the
general law of the State for the illegal fishing for and catch-
ing trout and land-locked salmon.

Sect. 3. In all prosecutions arising under this act, municipal and police courts and trial justices within their respective counties shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts, and all fines, forfeitures and penalties received for any violation of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving the same to the State Treasurer, and credited to fines and license fees for the protection of birds and game.
