STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to prohibit the throwing of sawdust and other mill waste into Cambridge river, so-called, in the towns of Upton and Grafton, in Oxford county.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall put, or allow the same to be
2 done by any person within his employ, into Cambridge river,
3 so-called, in the towns of Upton and Grafton, in the County
4 of Oxford, any mill waste, slabs, edgings, sawdust, or any
5 other mill waste of a fibrous nature created in the manufac-
6 ture of any sawn or planed lumber, or shall place or deposit
7 the same on the banks of said river in such negligent or
8 careless manner that the same shall fall or be washed into

9 said river, or with the intent that the same shall fall or be
10 washed into said river.

Whoever shall violate any of the provisions of this section
12 shall be subject to a penalty of not less than fifty dollars nor
13 more than one hundred dollars and costs of prosecution for
14 each offense.

Sect. 2. In all prosecutions arising under this act, muni-
2 cipal and police courts and trial justices, within their respec-
3 tive counties, shall have, upon complaint, original and con-
4 current jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts,
5 and all fines, forfeitures and penalties received for violation
6 of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving the
7 same to the State Treasurer, and credited to fines and license
8 fees for the protection of birds and game.
