HOUSE AMENDMENT A to House Document 210.

---

House Document No. 210 is hereby amended by striking  
2 out the words, "less than" in the sixth line of Section 1 of  
3 said bill, and the words, "or more than thirty-two ounces and  
4 three drams," in the seventh line of Section 1 of said bill,  
5 and the words "less than" in the eighth line of Section 1 of  
6 said bill, and the words "or more than sixteen ounces and two  
7 drams" in the ninth line of Section 1 of said bill, and the  
8 words "less than" in the tenth line of Section 1 of said bill,  
9 and the words "or more than eight ounces and one dram"  
10 in the tenth and eleventh lines of Section 1 of said bill, and  
11 the words "shall be condemned, all bottles within the above  
12 limits" in the eleventh and twelfth lines of Section 1 of said  
13 bill, so that said section when amended shall read as follows:

'Section 2. All measures, cans or other vessels used in  
15 the sale of milk shall be sealed by the sealer of weights and  
16 measures, by wine measure, containing thirty-two ounces to  
17 the quart, and all quart bottles containing thirty-two ounces  
18 and all pint bottles containing sixteen ounces, and all half-  
19 pint bottles containing eight ounces shall be passed as con-  
20 taining full measure, and all other measures, cans or other  
21 vessels shall be marked by the sealer with figures indicating  
22 the quality which they hold; and whoever sells by any other  
23 measure, can or vessel, forfeits twenty dollars for each of-  
24 fense.'
