## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to authorize the Bar Harbor & Union River Power Company to acquire the property and franchises of the Ellsworth Power Supply Company.

### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The Bar Harbor & Union River Power Com2 pany is hereby authorized and empowered to acquire by pur3 chase, lease, consolidation, merger, or otherwise, the prop4 erties, rights, privileges and franchises of the Ellsworth
5 Power Supply Company; and the power and authority is
6 hereby given to the Ellsworth Power Supply Company to
7 sell, lease, consolidate, merge, or otherwise dispose of its

8 property and franchises to the Bar Harbor and Union River

- 9 Power Company, upon such terms and conditions as may be 10 agreed upon by the stockholders of said companies, subject 11 to the provisions of Section 56 to 67, both inclusive, of Chap12 ter 47 of the Revised Statutes, and subject also to the rights 13 of all creditors of the said companies.
- Sect. 2. The location of the power transmission lines of 2 said Ellsworth Power Supply Company from its power 3 house in Ellsworth to its receiving station in the town of 4 Veazie, and the location of the power transmission lines of 5 said Bar Harbor & Union River Power Company, from said 6 power house in Ellsworth, to its receiving station in the 7 town of Bar Harbor as now constructed and operated are 8 hereby ratified, approved and permitted. Subject, however, 9 to the superintendence and control (in accordance with 10 Chapter 55 of the Revised Statutes of Maine), of the mu-11 nicipal officers of the various towns through which said 12 power transmission lines pass.
- Sect. 3. This act shall in no way affect suits pending or 2 rights vested previous to its approval.
