AN ACT to permit certain plantations to assume the maintenance of their roads and bridges.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. Plantations organized under sections one hundred and fifteen and one hundred and sixteen of chapter 3 four of the revised statutes, or amendments thereof, and 4 having less than two hundred inhabitants, shall have the 5 right to assume the maintenance and repair of the ways and 6 bridges within their borders, by raising and expending money 7 therefor, in which case they shall be subject to the provisions of section one hundred and eighteen of said chapter 8 9 and also those of section forty-one of chapter twenty-three 10 of said revised statutes, as amended.

Sect. 2. If money be raised for this purpose at any annual meeting of such a plantation in the month of March, the clerk thereof shall immediately notify the clerk of the county commissioners of the county in which such plantation is situated, who shall make a record of that fact, and thereupon said county commissioners shall be relieved, for that year, from all duty respecting the ways and bridges in said plantation, and all assessments made by them upon persons owning property in said plantation for the repair of roads and bridges, and the appointment of an agent to expend the same shall, thereupon, become null and void.
