STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVED, to provide for repairs of road leading from Roach River to the Grant Farm.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars to aid in the repair 3 of the road leading from Roach River to the Grant Farm, 4 so-called, near the out-let of Ragged Lake. The same to 5 be expended upon that portion of the road between the 6 southerly line of township number one, range thirteen, Pis-7 cataquis county, and the Grant Farm, under the direction 8 of an agent to be appointed for that purpose by the Gover-9 nor and Council. ·

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The road from Roach River, to the Grant Farm, so called, is an important thoroughfare used very extensively by lumber operators, hunters and sportsmen. There is a postoffice at Grant Farm. Many hundreds of tons of supplies and outfits for the camps are annually transported over the road to be used in the lumber operation. Hundred of men journey over the road every year and teams are daily passing over the same. The road is now in bad repair and is not safe or convenient for travel. It runs wholly through the wilderness and unincorporated townships and no person is willing to undertake the burden of putting a road in such condition as to be safe and convenient for travellers.
