STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend section eighty-nine of chapter one hundred eighty-four of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and seven, relating to the Compensation of Selectmen.,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Section eighty-nine of chapter one hundred 2 eighty-four of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and 3 seven is hereby amended by striking out the words "and 4 fifty cents," and also by striking out the third word in the 5 last sentence of said section and in place thereof inserting 6 the word 'three,' so that as amended said section shall read 7 as follows:

'Section 89. If any town does not choose assessors, or if so 9 many of them refuse to accept, that there are not such a

10 number as the town voted to have, the selectmen shall be the 11 assessors, and each of them shall be sworn as an assessor. 12 and each selectmen and assessor shall be paid for his ser-13 vices two dollars for every day necessarily and actually em-14 ployed in the services of the town. Towns having two thou-15 sand or more inhabitants may vote to pay their selectmen a 16 compensation not exceeding five dollars a day for time 17 actually spent in the service of the town.
