STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to prohibit the swelling of scallop meats by artificial
means.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall swell, or expand, scallop meats,
2 by artificial means, by the use of fresh water, baking soda,
3 or by any other process. Whosoever violates the provisions
4 of this act, shall be punished by a fine of five dollars for
5 each gallon of scallops so treated. Judges of municipal
6 courts and trial justices shall have jurisdiction of the offence
7 described in this act. Said fine shall be collected by action
8 of debt.
