STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in a portion of Sandy River
Stream, Franklin County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to take,
2 catch or kill more than thirty-five fish in all in any one day
3 in Sandy River stream, so called, Franklin county, from
4 Sandy River pond down as far as the Weymouth Bridge,
5 so called, across said stream.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this
2 act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in
3 the general law of the State for the illegal fishing for, tak-
4 ing, catching or killing of trout or landlocked salmon.

Sect. 3. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and
2 police courts and trial justices within their respective coun-
3 ties shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent
4 jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts, and all
5 fines, forfeitures and penalties received for violation of
6 this act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving the
7 same to the State treasurer, and credited to fines and license
8 fees for the protection of birds and game.
