STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to regulate the length of trout which may be taken
in certain ponds in Oxford county.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to take, catch or kill any
2 trout less than nine inches in length in Overset, Round,
3 South, Indian, Twitchell or Hicks ponds, in the town of
4 Greenwood, or in North pond in the towns of Greenwood
5 and Woodstock, or in Bryant's, Big, Concord, or Little
6 Concord ponds, in the town of Woodstock, or in Shag or
7 Abbott ponds in the town of Sumner, under the same pen-
8 alty as is provided in the general law of the State for the
9 illegal fishing for and catching trout and landlocked salmon.

Sect. 2. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and
2 police courts and trial justices, within their respective coun-
3 ties, shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent
4 jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts, and all
5 fines, forfeitures and penalties received for any violation
6 of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving
7 the same to the State treasurer, and credited to fines and
8 license fees for the protection of birds and game.
