STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to regulate the taking of fish from Lower Kezar pond, in Fryeburg, Oxford county, Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to take or catch any black 2 bass, pickerel, or any other fish from Lower Kezar pond, 3 Fryeburg, or any of its tributaries for sale, or to sell the 4 same, and no person shall take more than fifteen pounds of 5 fish in any one day from said Lower Kezar pond or its tribu-6 taries.

Sect. 2. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take or catch any 2 of the fish mentioned in section one, while fishing through 3 the ice in any of the above named waters except during the 4 months of March and April, and then only as provided by

5 the general laws, regulating the use of lines while so fishing.6 The number of pounds to be taken, as provided in section7 one.

Sect. 3. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act 2 shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the 3 general law of the State for the illegal fishing for and catch-4 ing trout and landlocked salmon.

Sect. 4. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and 2 police courts and trial justices within their respective coun-3 ties, shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent 4 jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts, and all 5 fines, forfeitures and penalties received for violation of this 6 act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving the same 7 to the State Treasurer, and credited to fines and license fees 8 for the protection of birds and game.
