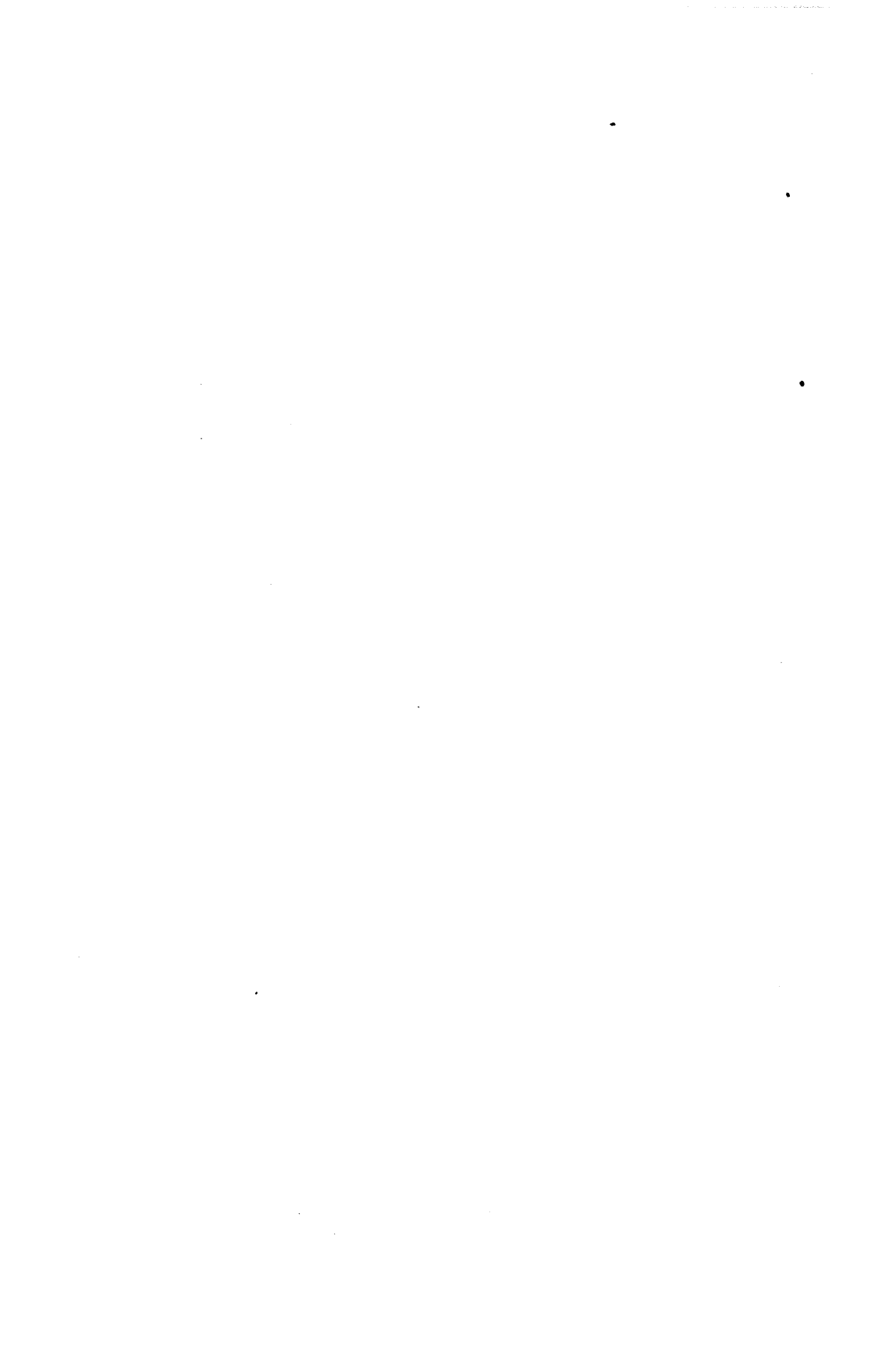
AN ACT to amend section one hundred and thirteen of chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter eleven of the Public Laws of 1905, relating to the number of trustees of State Normal Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section one hundred and thirteen of chapter 2 fifteen of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter eleven 3 of the Public Laws of 1905, is hereby further amended by 4 substituting for the word "eight" in the second line of said 5 section as amended, the word 'nine' and by substituting for 6 the word "six" also in the second line of said section as so 7 amended the word 'seven,' so that said section as amended 8 shall read as follows:

‘Section 113. Said schools are under the direction of a
10 board of nine trustees, seven of whom shall be appointed by
11 the governor with the advice and consent of the council, for
12 not more than three years under one appointment; and the
13 governor and State superintendent of public schools are, by
14 virtue of their office, members of the board. Said board has
15 charge of the general interests of said schools; shall see that
16 the affairs thereof are conducted as required by law and by
17 such by-laws as the board adopt; employ teachers and lec-
18 turers for the same; and annually, on the first day of Decem-
19 ber, lay before the governor and council, for the informa-
20 tion of the legislature, a financial statement, furnishing an
21 accurate detailed account of the receipts and expenditures
22 for the school year preceding.’

Sect. 2. This amendment is enacted upon condition that
2 the Machias Normal School act so called becomes a law.
