On this 19th day of February, 1909, personally appeared Freeman B. Andrews who on oath made and subscribed to the following: That I shall be 75 years of age in the coming March, that I served in the 27th unassigned Me. Vols. in 1865 in the war of the Rebellion. That I am not receiving a U. S. pension, and am not able to earn a support for myself and family. I have no property save two cows. My wife and her sister own a home which at the present time is mortgaged for its full value.
