STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the towns of Edmunds and Dennysville in the county of Washington.

Resolved, That the sum of three thousand dollars be and 2 hereby is appropriated, to be paid out of any funds in the 3 State treasury, toward the building of a permanent bridge 4 across Dennys river between the towns of Edmunds and 5 Dennysville in the county of Washington, said sum to be 6 payable when said towns have completed said bridge by an 7 expenditure of at least six thousand dollars, to be equally 8 divided between the said towns, the said bridge to be first 9 accepted as satisfactory by the State highway commissioner 10 and the bills contracted in building the same to be approved 11 by him, the said appropriation being used to reimburse each 12 town for fifty for cent of its expenditure or so much thereof 13 as said appropriation will cover.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The length of the proposed bridge is about one hundred twenty-five feet. The bridge now located at this point is an old, unsafe wooden bridge and the plan is to replace it with a safe and permanent bridge. In addition to this bridge, Dennysville maintains five bridges besides three which it helps Edmunds to maintain.

Edmunds has five long bridges besides the three which it helps to maintain.

The two towns keep up thirty-six miles of road.

The valuation of Dennysville is one hundred fifty-six thousand. The population is four hundred eighty-two. The tax rate is twenty-two mills.

The valuation of Edmunds is eighty-nine thousand. Tax rate, thirty-two mills. Population is about four hundred and ninety-two.
