STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to encourage the teaching of Manual Training, Domestic Science and Agriculture in Academies and to repeal Chapter 78 of the Public Laws of one thousand nine hundred and seven.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Any incorporated academy in the State maintaining a course in manual training, domestic science or agriculture, approved by the State Superintendent of Schools, shall be entitled to receive annually from the State, in addition to the State aid, if any, now provided by law, and to be paid in the same manner, a sum equal to the amount expended by said academy for instruction in such course, not exceeding two hundred and fifty dollars for each of said courses.

Sect. 2. Chapter seventy-eight of the Public Laws of one thousand nine hundred and seven is hereby repealed.
