IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend Section thirteen of Chapter nine of the
Revised Statutes, relating to the assessment of taxes on logs
and lumber.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section thirteen of chapter nine of the Revised
2 Statutes is hereby amended by adding, at the end of said
3 section, the following paragraph:

XI. All logs, lumber, wood, bark, pulp wood and bolts
5 shall be taxed in the town where they are on the first day of
6 April, provided, however, that if such property is in transit,
7 and beyond the limits of the town where it was cut or man-
8 ufactured, it shall be taxed in the town where the owner is
9 a resident.
