IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend section sixty-four of chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes relating to the tuition of pupils in secondary schools.

It is hereby enacted by the People of the State of Maine:

Section 1. Section sixty-four of chapter fifteen is hereby

- 2 amended by inserting after the word "schools" in line three
- 3 of said section the words "before the first day of September
- 4 for the preceding school year," and by striking out the word
- 5 "one-half" in line nine thereof and inserting in place thereof
- 6 the word 'two-thirds,' and by striking out the words "two
- 7 hundred fifty" in line ten thereof and inserting in place
- 8 thereof the words 'five hundred,' so that said section, when
- 9 amended, shall read as follows:

'Section 64. When any town shall have been required to 11 pay and has paid tuition as aforesaid, the superintending 12 school committee of such town shall make a return under 13 oath to the State superintendent of public schools before the 14 first day of September for the preceding school year, stating 15 the name of each youth, for whom tuition has been paid, 16 the amount paid for each, and the name and location of the 17 school which each has attended, and thereupon shall be paid, 18 annually, in the month of December, from the State Treas-19 ury out of the appropriation for the support of free high 20 schools, to each town paying tuition and making return as 21 aforesaid, a sum equal to two-thirds of the amount thus paid 22 by such town, not exceeding five hundred dollars.'
