IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Pierce pond, so-called, in Som-  
erset County.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for,  
2 take, catch or kill any kind of fish through the ice in Pierce  
3 pond, so-called, in Somerset county. It shall also be unlaw-  
4 ful for any person to have in possession any fish taken  
5 through the ice in said pond. During open season on said  
6 pond it shall be unlawful for any person in any one day to  
7 take, catch or kill or have in possession more than fifteen  
8 pounds of fish in all taken from said pond.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this

2 act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the  
3 general law of the State for the illegal fishing for and catch-  
4 ing of trout and land-locked salmon.

Sect. 3. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and  
2 police courts and trial justices within their respective coun-  
3 ties, shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent  
4 jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts, and all  
5 fines, forfeitures and penalties received for violation of this  
6 act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving the same  
7 to the State Treasurer, and credited to fines and license fees  
8 for the protection of birds and game.
