STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to regulate the hunting of ducks and other water
fowl in Bluehill bay and Eggmoggin Reach, so-called.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person at any time
2 to use boats or launches of any kind propelled by steam,
3 naphtha, gasoline or electricity, or any other mode than the
4 ordinary sail boat or row boat, in chasing, hunting or gun-
5 ning any sea birds, duck or water fowl in any of the waters
6 of Bluehill Bay, so-called, or in Eggmoggin Reach, so-
7 called, on the coast of Maine, in Hancock County, under a
8 penalty of not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than
9 one hundred dollars and costs of prosecution for each of-
10 fense.

For the purposes of this act Bluehill Bay shall be considered to be the waters bounded on the west by Bluehill and Brooklin to the end of Naskeag Point, so-called; on the east by Long Island and Tinker's Island to Pond Island, so-called; on the south by a direct line from the southern extremity of said Pond Island to the end of Naskeag Point, so-called.

Eggmoggin Reach, so-called, shall be considered to be the waters extending from Little Deer Isle to Cape Rosier on the west; thence easterly to the end of Naskeag point, so-called; thence in a direct line to the eastern end of Stinson's Neck, so-called, in the eastern part of Deer Isle, said waters being bounded on the north by the towns of Brooksville, Sedgwick and Brooklin and on the south by Deer Isle and Little Deer Isle.

Sect. 2. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and police courts and trial justices within their respective counties shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts, and all fines, forfeitures and penalties received for violation of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving the same to the State treasurer, and credited to fines and license fees for the protection of birds and game.
