STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to provide for a fire and police commission for the town of Skowhegan.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Upon the acceptance of the provisions of this 2 act, as hereinafter provided, a board of fire and police com-3 missioners is hereby created in and for the town of Skow-4 hegan to consist of three persons who shall be appointed by 5 the selectmen of said town, one commissioner to serve until 6 the first day of April following his appointment and the 7 other two to serve, respectively, until one and two years 8 from said first day of April, and thereafter, at the expiration 9 of the term of office of a commissioner, his successor shall 10 be so appointed to serve three years.

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Sect. 2. With the exception of the right to raise and col-2 lect money therefor the town of Skowhegan is hereby au-3 thorized to delegate all its powers and that of its municipal 4 officers relating to the inspection of buildings, a fire depart-5 ment, the prevention and extinguishment of fires, and its 6 police officers and department, to said board of fire and police 7 commissioners.

Sect. 3. Said commissioners shall have power to adopt 2 by-laws and ordinances and perform all the duties imposed 3 upon said town and its municipal officers by chapter twenty-4 eight of the revised statutes and also all those relating to 5 the police and police officers in sections ninety three and 6 ninety-four of chapter four of the revised statutes, but no 7 change in the liability of said town shall be thereby created.

Sect. 4. The acceptance of the provisions of this act, at 2 any legal meeting of said town, by a majority of the legal 3 voters there present and voting, under a warrant containing 4 an article giving due notice thereof, shall constitute such 5 delegation of authority, and the term of the then existing 6 officers of the police and fire department of said town, shall 7 expire when their successors are appointed by said commis-8 sioners.

Sect. 5. Said fire and police commissioners shall be paid 2 such compensation as the town shall determine.
